Executive Summary

Use of Force

Incident Reporting 2020

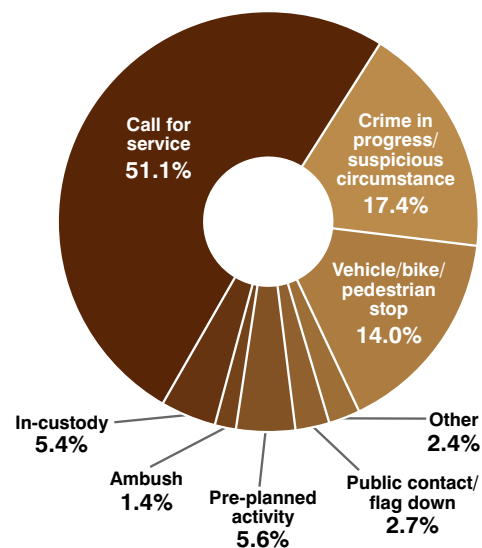
Use of Force Incident Reporting 2020 presents a summary overview of use of force and discharge of firearm incidents, as defined in Government Code (GC) section 12525.2.* This report focuses on data reported by California law enforcement agencies for incidents reported as having occurred in the calendar year 2020 to the California Department of Justice (DOJ). In accordance with the narrow definition of use of force in the statute, the data contained in this report only represent incidents where use of force resulted in serious bodily injury or death, or the discharge of a firearm. Caution must be exercised when making comparisons or generalizations with this data set since it does not contain the full spectrum of use of force incidents that occurred in California.

In reviewing data relating to events occurring during the 2020 calendar year, readers should be mindful of the potential effects of the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic. An officially declared State of Emergency covered most of the year, and various health-related orders, rules and guidelines significantly impacted daily life in California and across the world. Whether, how and to what extent the pandemic influenced the data in this report are questions requiring research and careful analysis. For the purposes of this report, the Department simply acknowledges this potential issue.

INCIDENTS

- In 2020, there were 708 incidents that involved use of force resulting in serious bodily injury or death of a civilian or officer; or the discharge of a firearm (Table 1).
- Of the 708 incidents, 313 reported a discharge of a firearm (Table 8A).
- Of the 708 incidents, 51.1 percent (362) occurred during a call for service, 17.4 percent (123) occurred while either a crime was in progress or while officers were investigating suspicious persons or circumstances, and 14.0 percent (99) resulted from a vehicle/bike/pedestrian stop (Table 2A).
- Of the 708 incidents, 70.8 percent (501) resulted in an arrest (Table 2B).

CIVILIANS

- In 2020, 745 civilians were involved in incidents that involved the discharge of a firearm or use of force resulting in serious bodily injury or death (Table 6A).
- Of the 745 civilians, 88.3 percent (658) were male, 8.1 percent (60) were female, 0.4 percent (3) were transgender, and 3.2 percent (24) fled the scene and their gender was unknown (Table 7).
- Of the 745 civilians, 42.6 percent (317) were Hispanic, 31.4 percent (234) were white, and 17.4 percent (130) were black (Table 7).
- Of the 745 civilians, 31.9 percent (238) were hit by the discharge of a firearm, 17.2 percent (128) and 10.6 percent (79) received force by other control hold/takedown tactics and electronic control device, respectively (Table 8B).
- Of the 745 civilians, 60.9 percent (454) were injured, 12.8 percent (95) were not injured, and 23.1 percent (172) died (Table 21).
- Of the 745 civilians, officers perceived that 442 civilians were armed. Of the 745 civilians, 353 were confirmed to be armed (Tables 15 and 16).

Percentage of Civilian Age by Age Group

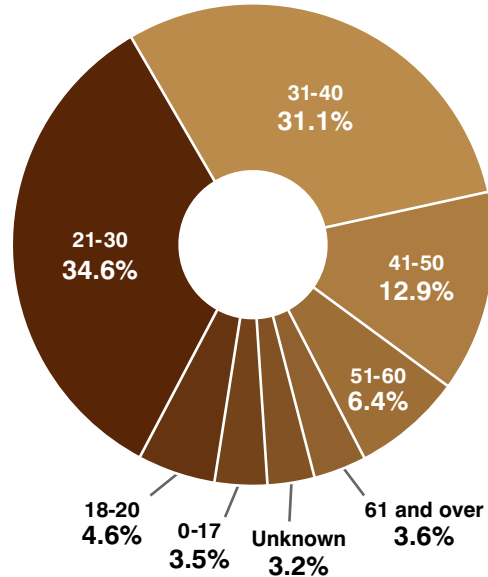
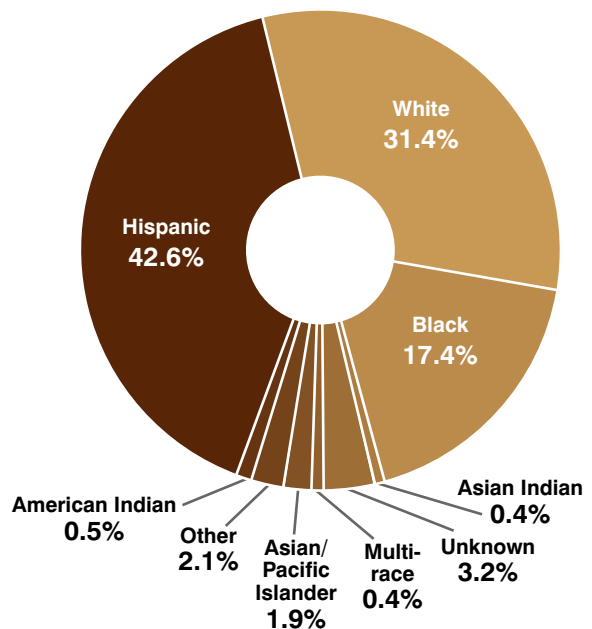

OFFICERS

- In 2020, 1,702 officers were involved in incidents that involved the discharge of a firearm or use of force resulting in serious bodily injury or death (Table 6A).
- Of the 1,702 officers, 93.6 percent (1,593) were male and 6.4 percent (109) were female (Table 7).
- Of the 1,702 officers, 54.5 percent (927) were white, 32.9 percent (560) were Hispanic, 4.9 percent (83) were Asian/Pacific Islander, and 4.3 percent (74) were black (Table 7).
- Of the 1,702 officers, 40.1 percent (682) did not receive force from a civilian, 25.4 percent (432) received force during physical contact with a civilian, and 12.2 percent (208) received force by the discharge of a firearm from a civilian (Table 8B).
- Of the 1,702 officers, 16.0 percent (273) were injured, 83.9 percent (1,428) were not injured, and 0.1 percent (1) died (Table 32).
- Of the 1,702 officers, 1,589 reported use of force. Officers reported they used force to affect arrest/take into custody (902), to overcome resistance (350), in defense of a 3rd party (321), or to prevent escape (16) (Table 29).

Percentage of Officer Age by Age Group

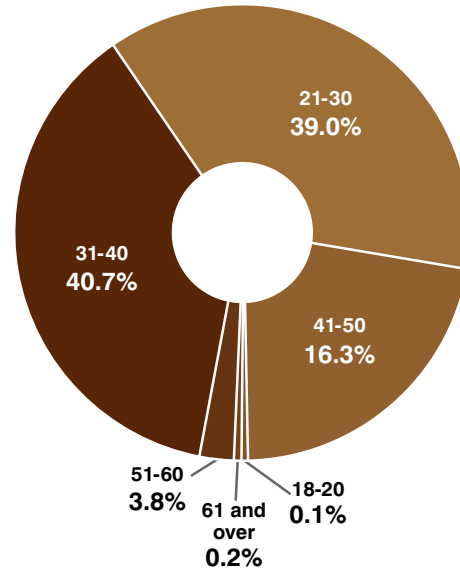
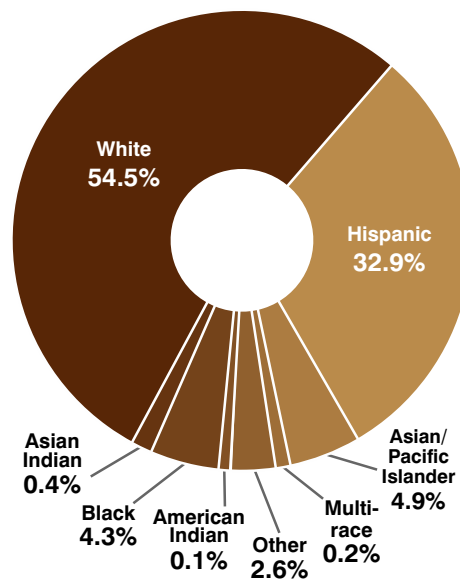

Understanding the Data

Characteristics and Known Limitations

BACKGROUND

In 2015, the California Legislature passed Assembly Bill (AB) 71, adding GC section 12525.2. This new statute mandates law enforcement agencies (LEAs) in California to report use of force incidents that result in serious bodily injury or death, or involve the discharge of a firearm. Effective January 1, 2016, all LEAs were required to begin collecting data on use of force incidents for submittal to the DOJ beginning January 1, 2017.

THE SYSTEM

The DOJ consulted with LEAs and stakeholders throughout the state in a series of regional meetings throughout 2015. This collaboration resulted in the development of use of force incident data elements and definitions, as well as a web-based data collection system through which LEAs may enter and submit use of force data to the DOJ. All agencies employing peace officers are required to report even if they have no use of force incidents (zero-reporting).

DATA LIMITATIONS

- 1) The data contained in the Use of Force repository are narrowly defined and do not represent the totality of use of force incidents that occur in California. LEAs are only required to report use of force incidents that result in serious bodily injury or death of either the civilian or the officer and all incidents where there is a discharge of a firearm. As such, caution must be exercised when using the data for comparisons or when calculating rates.
- 2) 2016 represented the first year of data collection and reporting. While every effort was made to provide access to all LEAs in the state, not all agencies reported. The DOJ anticipates and expects that consistency in reporting will improve with additional training, outreach efforts, and experience.
- 3) More than one officer may be involved in a single incident. Sometimes this includes officers that were not injured or did not physically use force against the civilian. We include data related to these officers to satisfy subsections 5-7 of section (b) of GC 12525.2.

- 4) Incidents reported after the close of the reporting year are not included in the data set and are noted here:

The Fremont Police Department discovered an unreported incident that occurred January 31, 2020 at 18:48. The Fremont Police Department and the Union City Police Department were involved in an officer involved shooting during the pursuit of a suspect vehicle leaving a reported robbery. Two civilians sustained non-life threatening injuries and the officers received no injuries. The Union City Police Department officers were present for the use of force, but no Union City Police officers discharged their firearms.

FUTURE ENHANCEMENTS

Each year of collection provides an opportunity to refine data elements and add useful contextual information. The DOJ will continue to work with stakeholders to provide a platform for improved data collection over time.

DEFINITIONS

Serious bodily injury is defined in GC section 12525.2. Please see the Legislation section on page 6 for further detail.

Discharge of a firearm - Includes any discharge of a firearm during an interaction between a civilian and an officer, regardless of whether any person was injured. A firearm is defined as a weapon that fires a shot by the force of an explosion, e.g., a handgun, rifle, shotgun, and other such device commonly referred to as a firearm. Not included in this definition are electronic control devices; stun guns; BB, pellet, air, or gas-powered guns; or weapons that discharge rubber bullets or bean bags.

Injury severity - Severity levels below “serious bodily injury” are included in the data set due to the fact that reporting is required for any discharge of a firearm.

LEGISLATION

Effective January 1, 2016, Chapter 462, Statutes of 2015 (AB 71) added GC section 12525.2 pertaining to the collection and reporting of use of force incidents resulting in serious bodily injury, as defined, discharge of firearm, or death. As such, on January 1, 2016, all LEAs were required to begin collecting use of force incidents for submittal to the DOJ beginning January 1, 2017.

GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 12525.2

- (a) Beginning January 1, 2017, each law enforcement agency shall annually furnish to the Department of Justice, in a manner defined and prescribed by the Attorney General, a report of all instances when a peace officer employed by that agency is involved in any of the following:
 - (1) An incident involving the shooting of a civilian by a peace officer.
 - (2) An incident involving the shooting of a peace officer by a civilian.
 - (3) An incident in which the use of force by a peace officer against a civilian results in serious bodily injury or death.
 - (4) An incident in which use of force by a civilian against a peace officer results in serious bodily injury or death.
- (b) For each incident reported under subdivision (a), the information reported to the Department of Justice shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:
 - (1) The gender, race, and age of each individual who was shot, injured, or killed.
 - (2) The date, time, and location of the incident.
 - (3) Whether the civilian was armed, and, if so, the type of weapon.
 - (4) The type of force used against the officer, the civilian, or both, including the types of weapons used.
 - (5) The number of officers involved in the incident.
 - (6) The number of civilians involved in the incident.
 - (7) A brief description regarding the circumstances surrounding the incident, which may include the nature of injuries to officers and civilians and perceptions on behavior or mental disorders.
- (c) Each year, the Department of Justice shall include a summary of information contained in the reports received pursuant to subdivision (a) through the department's OpenJustice Web Portal pursuant to Section 13010 of the Penal Code. This information shall be classified according to the reporting law enforcement jurisdiction. In cases involving a peace officer who is injured or killed, the report shall list the officer's employing jurisdiction and the jurisdiction where the injury or death occurred, if they are not the same. This subdivision does not authorize the release to the public of the badge number or other unique identifying information of the peace officer involved.
- (d) For purposes of this section, "serious bodily injury" means a bodily injury that involves a substantial risk of death, unconsciousness, protracted and obvious disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function of a bodily member or organ.

For statistical purposes, if multiple use of force types occurred in a single incident, a hierarchy of severity was applied to identify the most severe use of force type. The following tables display the hierarchy used in identifying the most severe use of force type. The lower the hierarchy number, the more severe the use of force type.

For statistical purposes, if multiple reasons are reported, a hierarchy of severity is used to identify the most severe reason. The lower the hierarchy number, the more severe the reason.
